Using an interactive tablet, the HistoPad, visitors begin their journey in 1163 when the first stones were laid. The journey continues through key historical events like arrival of the Holy Relics during the Crusades, Napoleon's coronation in 1804, the extraordinary 19th century reconstruction. The exhibition celebrates the individuals who helped make Notre Dame from the first artisans and craftsmen, to the firefighters and conservators today.
